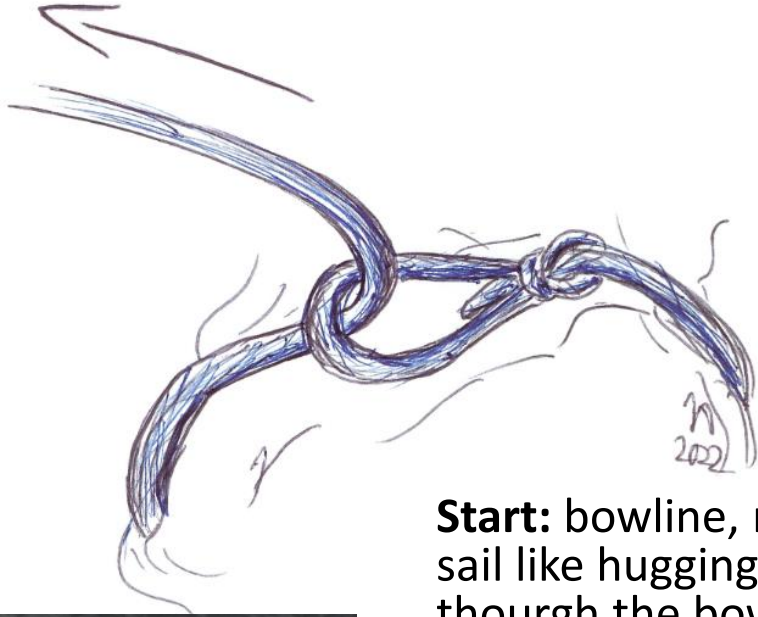


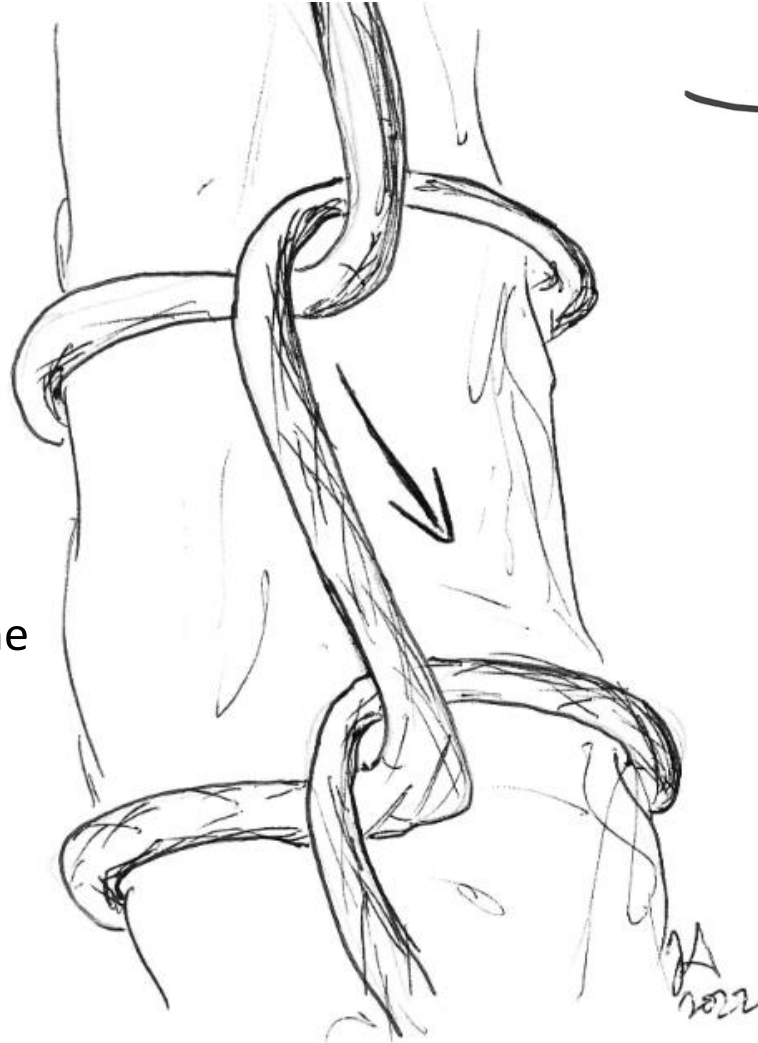
# Tying the sails



**Start:** bowline, rope around the sail like hugging, rope's end through the bowline loop, and tighten to opposite direction.



**At end:** tie with the "openable knot".



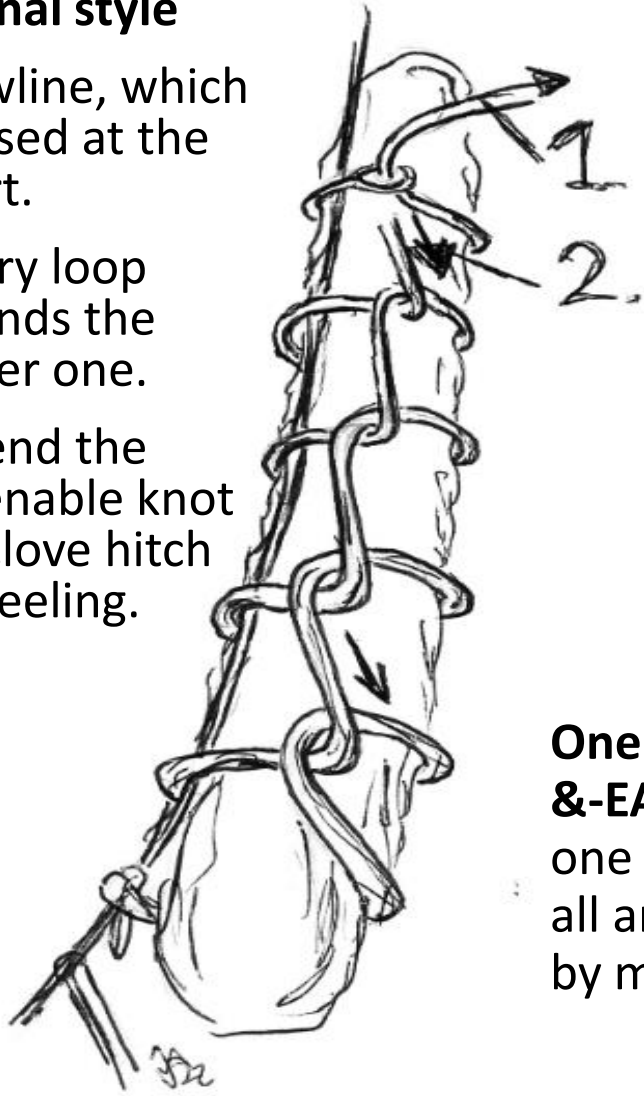
**(This is correct)** Check the correct tightening direction carefully.



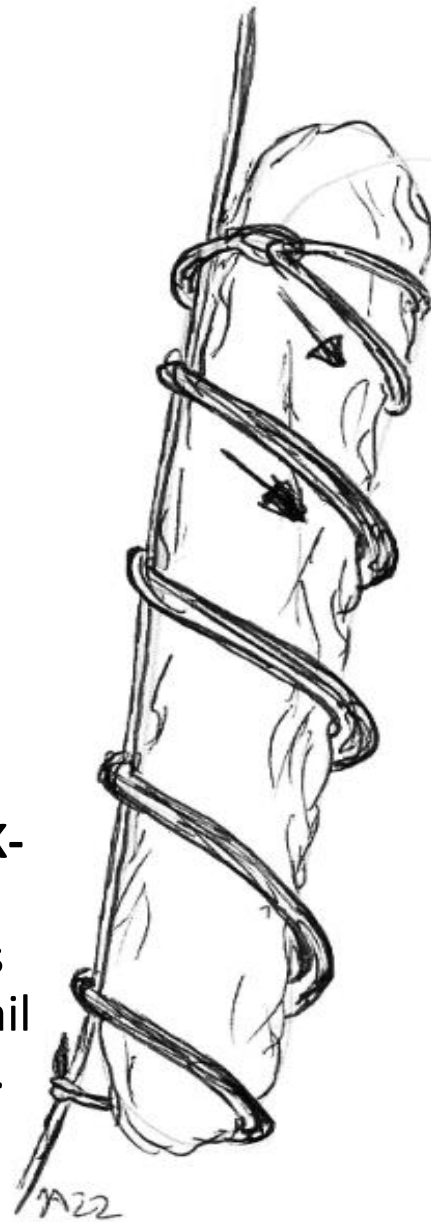
**(Up)** This is wrong.

## Traditional style

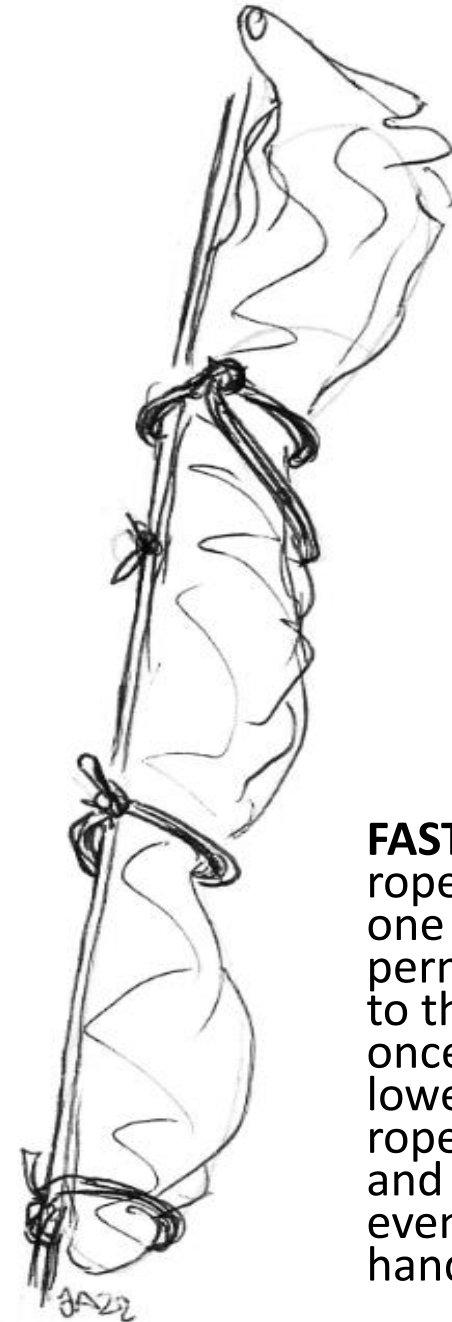
- 1) Bowline, which is used at the start.
- 2) Every loop rounds the other one.
- 3) At end the openable knot or clove hitch to reeling.



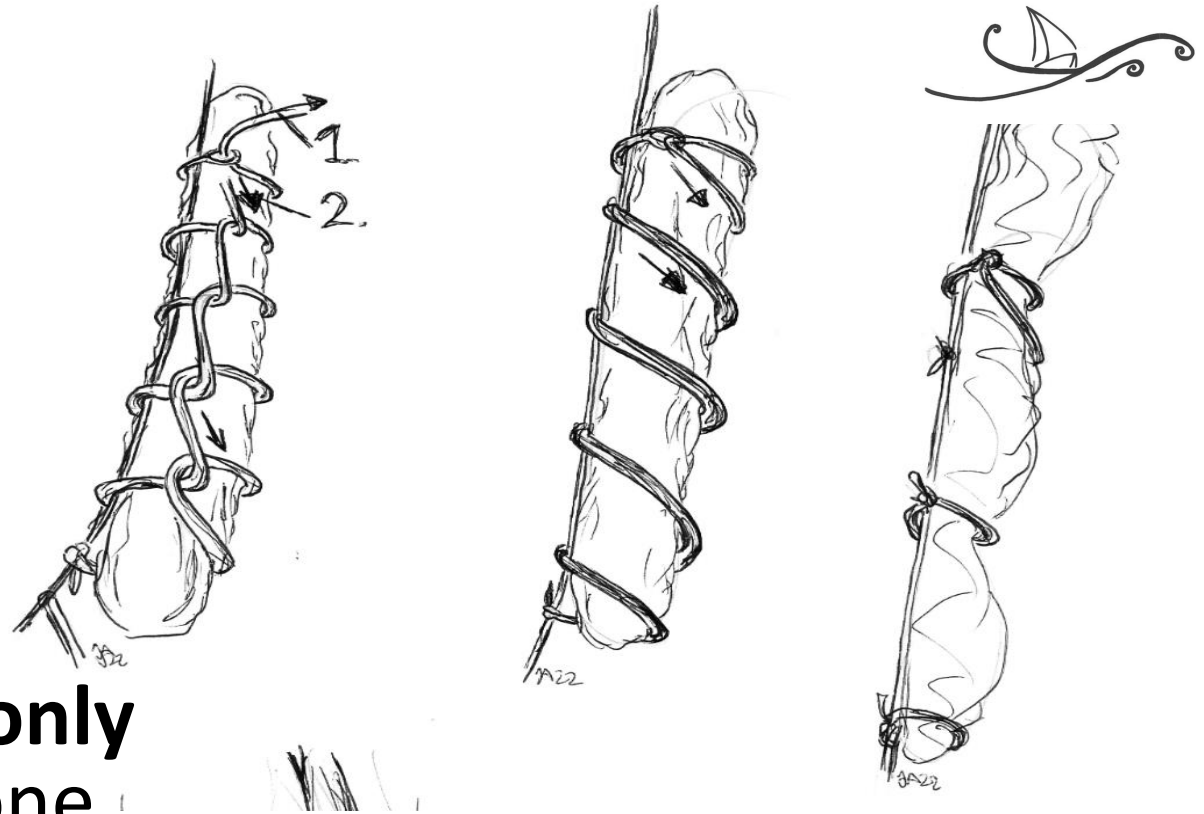
**One rope QUICK-  
&-EASY Style—**  
one rope rounds  
all around the sail  
by many rounds.



**FAST style—** three  
ropes, each with  
one ends  
permanently fixed  
to the reeling, and  
once sail is  
lowered, each  
rope is fast to tie  
and the sail stays  
even in storm in  
hand.



**There's one more style that only the true sailors know. – It's one that you can open the sail with ONLY 1 PULL once the sails is packed all properly. Can you do that?**
